How do we measure strength?

In the weight room, it's the number of plates on the squat bar. On a treadmill, it's speed, incline, calories burned – the little red numbers tracking our progress in real time.

But at the YMCA, we know that physical strength is just one dimension. We know that emotional strength, spiritual strength, the strength of our families and our communities, matter just as much – if not more.

In annual reports, the norm is to measure the strength of an organization by the numbers. Graphs, charts and columns of figures – black and red – are the traditional measure of strength. And success.

But in 2020, everything changed.

Like the rest of the world, we at the Y were stopped cold by the global pandemic, by a country and a community in fear, suffering, confused, concerned. Reckoning with the greatest health crisis to ever hit our community, suddenly the numbers we've used to measure strength all these years looked, well, not very strong at all. And not very important, either.

It was time to rethink how we measure strength.

Beyond facts and figures, strength presented itself differently this past year.



that was strength.




Together, we stayed strong. In the fall of 2020, we launched **The Strong Challenge**, a free, six-week virtual program open to everyone in the community.

OVER 1800 NEIGHBORS

signed up – both Y members and non-members – and received weekly tips, info and goals to help them get healthier anywhere. The most powerful part of the program was the sense of community that arose among participants who shared their challenges and cheered each other on every step of the way.

For three decades and counting, the **Williams Family & Wayne Densch Charities** have been community champions of the YMCA of Central Florida, generously contributing more than \$6.6 million to support multiple programs and family centers. In 2019-2020, they continued their commitment to the Y funding renovations at the **Wayne Densch YMCA** and the **J. Douglas Williams YMCA**. The Williams Family & Wayne Densch Charities also invested in the creation of a new YMCA in The Packing District, which will be named the **Leonard & Marjorie Williams Family YMCA** in their honor.



The incomparable support of **Dr. Phillips Charities** has made the YMCA of Central Florida what it is today, and their partnership continues to shape our future. Over the past thirty years, they have invested more than \$50 million, including an \$8.9 million lead gift and the land to build the new Leonard & Marjorie Williams Family YMCA in The Packing District.

Our community and our YMCA association have had an intertwined history. In fact, it was just 10 years after Orlando was incorporated that our Y here was first established in 1885.

During the ensuing 136 years since our inception, the Y, together with our Central Florida community, have experienced both seasons of growth as well as seemingly insurmountable difficulties that threatened our very existence. There were even periods of time when it looked like our Y was down for the count.

But we got back up.

Preceding generations of Y advocates demonstrated the measure of strength necessary to stand up to the adversity, to care for one another, and to find ways for the Y and our community to thrive once more. Now it's our turn.

2020 will forever be remembered for the indelible impact made by the specter of the COVID-19 pandemic. During this chapter of our YMCA's history, we have endured hardships unprecedented in our generation. For over eight weeks, all of our Ys were closed. To necessitate our sustainability, we had to make extremely difficult decisions and face a reality requiring us to reduce the number of Y locations and services. We got knocked down.

But, once again, we got back up.

Our mission compelled us forward. We determined to find ways to continue serving and building a community facing great need and the pain of injustice. Buoyed by the outpouring of prayers, generosity and faithfulness of so many of our members, donors, advocates, volunteers, partners and staff, the Y has pivoted, innovated, transformed. Acts of kindness and courage emerged all across our neighborhoods, and even from far away. In the final weeks of 2020, we received a surprise blessing from advocate and renowned philanthropist MacKenzie Scott. She had noticed our association's impact and selected us to receive an incredibly generous and unsolicited donation based on our demonstrated track record of leading positive and inclusive change for all in Central Florida.

So, while the future is still uncertain, we draw confidence as we remain firm in our foundation of faith and in the knowledge that the Y has the measure of strength necessary to keep building a stronger Central Florida that empowers all of our neighbors to reach their highest potential in spirit, mind, and body.


